## ANNUAL BLACK GOLD COMPOST DISTRIBUTION SATURDAY, JUNE 13 & 20

The infamous mulch will be available on these dates between 8AM-1PM at the Joint Municipal Compost Area (corner of Business Rte. 22 and Rodi Road). There is a suggested donation of \$2/vehicle (bring your own containers) or \$10 per hi-lift bucket full dumped into your truck. Arrangements can be made at the site to have a small dump truck load delivered to your home. Cost for delivery is \$30, plus \$10/bucket of mulch.



#### LEAF COLLECTION - MONDAY, MAY 18 & JUNE 1



These are the <u>ONLY</u> dates that the borough will pick up leaves. Leaves that are in paper, biodegradable bags will be picked up at the curb. Place your bags at the curb on Sunday evening. Do not place other yard debris in the bags because they will not be removed. Bags are available at the Municipal Building and at Tyke's Shell Station on the Greensburg Pike at a cost of \$3.00/five

bags. After these two pick-up dates borough residents will have to make arrangements with a landscaping company to remove leaves.

#### BOROUGH OF CHURCHILL REAL ESTATE TAXES

Tax statements were mailed at the beginning of March. Discount amount was due April 30 and the face amount is due by June 30. A 10% penalty will be assessed thereafter. If you have paid off your mortgage, please contact the Borough office to ensure you receive the tax bills in a timely manner. School district tax statements will be mailed on or about July 1.

#### BUILDING PERMITS SWIMMING POOL, DECK, SHED, ROOM ADDITIONS, ETC.

Permits are required for these items. Please visit the Borough Office to obtain the necessary paperwork and to ascertain that you are in compliance with the Zoning Ordinance for side and rear yard variances. Any inside alterations changing the structure also require a permit. Citations will be issued for persons violating the ordinance.

The CRB hopes that you will take part in some or all of the activities to enjoy your hometown and to meet your neighbors. BULLOCK PENS PARK FIX-UP DAY: On Saturday, May 16th [with Sunday, the 17th as a rain date], residents of Churchill are invited to volunteer at Bullock Pens Park to plant, to pull weeds, to clear trails, and to help make the park a nicer setting in which to enjoy nature, walk dogs, or hold family picnics in the shelter. Work will begin at 9 am but if you can't get there that early, your help will still be welcome later. Please bring work gloves, basic gardening tools, a small shovel, etc. The borough has now installed running water at the park so you



do not have to bring any. If you have any native perennials (e.g. violets, wild geraniums, bloodroot, jack-in-the-pulpit, ferns, etc.) to donate, that would help add color and diversity to the park's flora. To make sure the day isn't all work and no play, there will be a guided walk along the park's nature trail for those interested in hiking. As the weather improves, the Churchill Recreation Board hopes that our residents will make an effort to get to know their neighbors. We are encouraging you to organize a "Block or Street Party" to which everyone on the street or block is invited. [Some won't be able to



make it but at least they'll know they were invited.] It might be an outdoor Pot Luck Dinner, Hot Dog Roast, or just a gathering for dessert. When neighbors know each other, they look out for each other. That makes your street safer for everyone. Of course, during your gathering, you might discuss how your street could get involved in the borough's 75th anniversary celebration.

CHURCHILL'S 75TH ANNIVERSARY: This year Churchill celebrates the 75th anniversary of its incorporation. A picnic and community day will be held on Saturday, August 29th at the Plaza area of the Westinghouse R & D property, accessible through the gated entrance off Beulah Road. [In case of rain, we will move the event indoors to the cafeteria area.] The celebration will begin at 11 am and end at 5 pm. This is a perfect occasion to invite your children who grew up in Churchill



to come back and see all of their old friends and neighbors. The Churchill Recreation Board is meeting to work out the details of the event but we really need the help of all of Churchill's residents to make it a success. We are still looking for long term residents of Churchill who have been here for 25+ years (Silver Level), 50+ years (Gold Level), and even 75 years (the Diamond Level) so they can be acknowledged. (So far, we have found no 75 year residents so if you are out there, please let us know.) We have a committee working on assembling the history of Churchill so if you have any memories or photos to share, please send them to the Borough Office marked "Churchill 75th Memories." We are hoping that at the Churchill Block Parties being held this summer, people living on a particular street will volunteer to plan/sponsor/host a particular activity at the event. So far one group has volunteered to have a "Face Painting" table but we need lots of other activities. Churchill organizations (Garden Clubs, Scout troops, Environmental groups, Political Parties, AARP groups, Fire Company, etc.), businesses, and folks from a street or neighborhood are invited to host a table with an
