YOUR VOTE COUNTS - November 6, 2007

In odd-number years we turn our election attention to local offices. These are positions that have the most immediate impact on our daily lives. Three members of Churchill Borough Council and a school



board member will be elected on November 6th. We are fortunate in this area to have high quality people willing to serve us in these unpaid positions. In addition there are county elections for Common Pleas Court Judges (4), Chief Executive, Controller, District Attorney, Treasurer, Sheriff, and County Council Candidate at Large. State-wide there are two positions each for Justice of the Supreme Court and Judge of Superior Court. VOTE anytime between 7 AM and 8 PM on Tuesday, November 6th. If you need to check your vot-

November 6th. If you need to check your voting location or you need an absentee ballot or voter registration form, all are available at the Borough Building during business hours. You are asked to display campaign signs for no more than two weeks prior to the election. Make sure that these are of standard size, that they are installed on private property with permission of the owner, and that they are removed promptly after the election.

The Churchill Police Department will assist or aid in the installation/adjustment of a Child Passenger Restraint Systems and Booster Seats. The assistance or advice is provided to Churchill residents without fee or charge. Residents



should contact Officer Welch at 412-241-4466 from 3PM-11PM on Monday, Tuesday or Wednesday to make an appointment. Officer Welch recently was certified as a child passenger safety technician by the National Highway Traffic Safety Administration. Child passenger safety technicians are not civilly liable for an act or omission that occurs solely in the inspection, installation, or adjustment of a child restraint system. (Pa MVC Section 4586)


