It's a presidential election year! On **Tuesday, November 6, 2012** you are urged to vote anytime between 7 AM and 8 PM. Voting is one of our most important responsibilities, rights, and privileges as citizens. Positions on this year's ballot are:

Federal: President and Vice President

of the United States United States Senator

United States House of Representatives

Member (14th District)

State: Attorney General

Auditor General

Treasurer

Pennsylvania State Senator (43rd District) Pennsylvania House of Representatives

Members (34th District)

The November election, unlike the spring primary, is a general, open election. That means you can vote for the candidate of your choice for each office without regard to your party registration, independents included. Inform yourself about the candidates running in the races listed above. Then cast your vote on November 6th and let's aim for full Churchill participation!

NEW AND IMPORTANT FOR 2012.

The provisions of Pa. Act 18, known as "Pennsylvania's Voter ID Law" requires <u>registered voters to show photo identification at the polls</u> (unless the law is "stayed" or "overturned" in the courts prior to November 6). Acceptable photo IDs include current PA driver's licenses, U.S. passports, military IDs, federal or state employee IDs, college/university IDs, or PA care facility IDs (e.g. personal care, assisted living, long-term care, nursing homes).

If you do not have an acceptable photo ID you can get one FREE (good for 10 years, usable only for voting) at any **Penn DOT license center**. The closest one to Churchill is in the Penn Hills Shopping Center at the corners of Rodi and Frankstown Roads. You must be registered to vote, and you must know your date of birth and Social Security number (documents not needed). You must also show two proofs of residence (e.g. utility bills, lease. deed, or mortgage papers).

NEED TO REGISTER? MOVED RECENTLY? WANT TO CHANGE PARTY? HAVE A CHILD TURNING 18 BY NOV. 6th?

All this is covered on one convenient, NEW registration form. Pick one up from the Churchill Borough Building or call the County Election Division at 412-350-4500 to get one by mail.

The <u>deadline for registering</u> is <u>October 9th</u> (<u>received</u> at the Election Division address below).

NEED AN ABSENTEE BALLOT

For yourself or a son/daughter away at college? NEW forms are at the **borough office** or **by mail from the County Election Division by calling 412-350-4500**. The form requires applicants to list their PA Driver's License number or the last four digits of their Social Security number. Filing an absentee ballot is a **two-step process**: **applying** for the ballot, and then, after receiving it, filling it out with your candidate selections and **returning** it in time to be received at the election division by Friday, November 2nd. Start the process as soon as possible.

Election tradition in Churchill asks that <u>candidate signs</u> be installed on your property <u>no sooner than two weeks prior</u> to the election (October 20-22) and removed within 48 hours after Nov. 6. Your cooperation helps us keep an uncluttered, unlittered community.

Churchill Meals on Wheels is a non-profit organization that delivers meals to homebound seniors five (5) days a week and operates out of Beulah Church. Providing an important service to residents of Churchill, this volunteer organization is always in need of additional manpower. The staff includes cooks, those who assemble the bag lunch, those who donate desserts, and the delivery drivers. Two to three times a month (about 2 hours) or

any amount of time you can give, are needed. The smiles and gratitude of the thankful recipients are very rewarding. Bonus: Not only does volunteering bring out one's best qualities and make an important difference in the lives of others, it has been proven that those who volunteer are happier people, experiencing a sense of achievement and personal fulfillment.

Although there is a nominal charge for the meals, the actual preparation of the meals and the delivering is done by volunteers. Each day's delivery includes a "brown bag" lunch, soup, and a hot meal. Special diets can be accommodated to a limited degree, such as low salt or diabetic. The cost is \$4 per day, and you can ask to receive a meal any number of days each week. Meals are delivered between 9:30-11:00am, Monday through Friday.




