## Relocation of Polling Places for Districts 2 & 3 in Churchill

The Administrative Staff of the Woodland Hills School District has relocated to Braddock, and the Woodland Hills Administration Building is now closed. Therefore, a new polling place has been identified for Districts 2 & 3 in Churchill. If you voted at the Woodland Hills Administration Building during prior elections, you will now be voting at St. John Fisher Church in Beaufort Hall, 33 Lewin Lane, Pittsburgh, PA 15235. Entrance to and exit from the church property are clearly marked with yellow arrows. Once on church property, follow the Voter/arrow signs to the entrance of the polling place (Beaufort Hall is 3/4 of the way around the church at the back). Handicap parking spaces will be set up right outside the entrance to Beaufort Hall. All other voters should follow the signs for voter parking by driving past the entrance to the polling place, continuing straight and taking the second left-hand turn into the parking lot. District 1 residents will continue to vote at the Churchill Borough Building, and District 4 residents will continue to vote at PACE School. If you are new to Churchill or not sure what district you reside in, please note in the table the streets which are located in each district and the respective polling place:



## LEAF PICK-UP

Leaf pick-up dates are on the following Mondays: October 19, 26, November 2, 9, 16, and 23. Please place **LEAVES ONLY**, in paper biodegradable bags at the curb on Sunday evening. The leaves are composted and next June the “black gold” will be available as a rich fertilizer for your trees and shrubs. If you gather more leaves after the last date of pick up, November 23, you will need to make special arrangements with a landscaper or other contractor to remove them.

Leaf bags are available at the Borough Building or J.P. Tyke Auto Service, 2531 Greensburg Pike at a cost of 5 bags for \$3.00. They are also available at your local home center.

It's a two-step process (requesting the form from and then returning the voted ballot to the Allegheny County Election Bureau, County

Office Building Room 609, 542 Forbes Avenue, Pittsburgh 15219.

Call 412-350-4518 to request absentee ballots. Call the Borough Office (412-241-7113) if you have any questions.

If you plan to host candidate signs in your yard, you are asked to put them up no sooner than October 20, 2015, two weeks prior to election day This has been a long tradition in Churchill and your cooperation is appreciated.

## LITTER, LITERALLY

Churchill residents have access to many roadways that make travel easy through our region. In addition to our local streets there are County roads (Greensburg Pike), state highways (Beulah and Brown Roads, Ardmore Boulevard), and Interstate-376 with six ramps that enter or exit our small



municipality. All this convenient infrastructure brings a lot of noise, pollution, and LITTER to the Borough. Environmental laws and vehicle manufacturers are making progress on the first two issues, but we need everyone's cooperation with the litter problem.

It is really a simple thing for each homeowner to do. Merely patrol your property on a regular basis and pick up any accumulated litter. Recycle clean cans and bottles in your blue bin; put out the rest on your regular garbage/trash collection day. Do the same for any vacant property next to yours and any undeveloped property across the street or road. For your safety remain alert for oncoming traffic! ## TURTLE CREEK VALLEY COUNCIL OF GOVERNMENTS

### OFFICE OF CODE ENFORCEMENT

Now that summer is fading to an end, we can turn our attention to the season that has that fun stuff falling from the skies above, no not snow yet! LEAVES. Leaves will soon be raining down from the trees above, falling onto the yards below and with that now would be a good time to plan on the method and frequency for getting all that colorful, albeit burdensome, foliage picked up and recycled.

Not only are the fallen leaves considered an accumulation of rubbish if left to pile up, but they also pose a fire hazard and can potentially harbor rodents and insects. Fortunately, the Borough has a recycling program established. That, in itself, gets you on track to seeing your lush lawns until the last drop of color falls from autumn into winter.

#### From the Borough Code:

- **Chapter 252 Solid Waste; Article III Collection and Disposal**

- o **§252-17 Collection Procedures for Leaves** – Collection of leaves may be made on such days of the week and at such times as shall be determined by the Borough Council or the Borough Manager. Leaves for collection shall be placed in paper biodegradable bags. Leaves shall not be placed in plastic bags. The collector shall employ suitable equipment that will properly confine the leaves so that they will be transported over streets of the Borough without spillage or littering of the streets.

Lastly, I would like to remind residents of the Code sections regulating collection procedures for garbage and rubbish.

- **§252-14** -A maximum of two standard residential garbage cans with lids may be, stored at any side or rear yard location properly screened or shielded from adjoining residential properties prior to collection. All garbage and trash containers shall be properly stored until the designated pickup days when the containers must be brought to the curb as described in §252-15.

- **§252-15** -All rubbish designated for collection must be ready by 7:00 a.m. on the day of collection. However, no containers shall be placed at curbside earlier than 6:00 p.m., prevailing time, on the day prior to collection. Exceptions may be granted on an individual basis by the Borough Manager for occasional, special circumstances (e.g., illness). The owner should remove containers placed at curbside on the same day after being emptied by the contractor.

## Occupancy Inspection

The list outlined below is a partial listing of conditions inspected prior to occupancy. The topics are not to be considered all-inclusive or final, but can be used in preparation of the inspection that will be conducted to minimize the occurrence of potential deficiencies.

### Smoke Alarms

- o 1 in every bedroom / room used for sleeping
- o 1 outside of the areas used for sleeping (hallways)
- o 1 on each level / story including the basement

### Openable Windows

- o Open and stay open by design
- o All hardware (locks & cranks) work as designed
- o Glass intact, no cracks or missing panes
- o Insect screens in place on windows that are required for ventilation

### Doors

- o Fit and operate within their frames
- o Hardware (locks & handles) work as designed
- o Egress doors open from interior without keys or

special knowledge of operation

### Interior Surfaces

- o Clean & sanitary conditions
- o No peeling, flaking paint
- o No damaged plaster / drywall
- o No missing / damaged tub tiles

### Stairs – Interior or Exterior

- o Handrail required for stairs w/ more than 4 risers
- o Guards required on any open portion / side greater than 30 inches above the grade below
- o All handrails and guards firmly fastened & capable of supporting normally imposed loads

### Decks, Porches & Balconies

- o Guards required on any open portion / side greater than 30 inches above the grade below
- o Structurally sound & good repair

### Electrical Receptacles

- o Properly installed and working for their location (no open grounds on 3 prong outlets)
- o Securely fastened / attached
- o Receptacle faceplate covers in place

### Ceiling Lights

- o Properly installed and working for their location
- o All globes, domes and covers in place
- o No broken / damaged bulbs

### Electrical / Facilities & Equipment

- o Service panel is 3 wire rated a minimum of 60 amps
- o Access to panel is maintained free of obstructions
- o All wiring, equipment and appliances properly installed and maintained
- o No hazards due to improper wiring or installation (no open junction boxes)
- o No extension cords used for permanent wiring
- o Light switch faceplate covers in place

### Mechanical Appliances, Furnace, Hot Water Tank

- o Work as designed & capable of performing intended function
- o No combustible materials stored near
- o Properly vented

- o Hot water tank relief valve discharge pipe 6 inches or less from the floor
- o Clothes dryer exhaust vent secure and vented directly to the exterior

**Plumbing Fixtures / Water System**

- o All fixtures properly installed and maintained in working order (water turned on)
- o Drains work as designed
- o Bathrooms & toilet rooms vented w/ fan or screened window
- o If laundry tub & garden hoses left attached while not in use have vacuum breaker attached

**Roof and Drainage**

- o Weather tight, works as designed
- o Gutters free of obstructions

**Exterior**

- o Premises identification / address numerals a minimum 4 inches high, contrasting in color w/ background and plainly visible from the street
- o No peeling, flaking paint or deteriorated wood surfaces
- o Weeds and grass less than 6 inches high
- o No accumulation of rubbish or garbage
- o Sidewalks and driveways in good repair
- o Sheds, fences and retaining walls maintained in good repair & structurally sound

**Swimming Pools**

- o Maintained safe, clean and sanitary
- o Properly enclosed (fence, gates)
