Real Estate Tax Collection Dates

The Churchill Borough Real Estate Tax Statements are mailed to all borough residents on March 1. The discount amount is due by April 30, and the face amount is due by June 30. Beginning July 1, the borough taxes will then be collected at the face amount with a 10% penalty. The Woodland Hills School District Real Estate Tax Statements are mailed to all borough residents on July 1. The discount amount is due by August 31, and the face amount is due by October 31. Beginning November 1, the school taxes will then be collected at the face amount with a 10% penalty.

The Woodland Hills School District Board of Directors has improved an installment payment plan for the Woodland Hills School District Real Estate Tax. NO discount will be allowed if the installment payment is chosen. The face tax amount must be divided into 3 equal payments as follows: Payment #1 - 1/3 face amount due by October 31; Payment #2 - 1/3 face amount due by January 31; Payment #3 - 1/3 face amount due by March 31 of the following year. If payments are not made by due dates, a 10% penalty will be assessed on the unpaid payment.

If you recently paid off your mortgage, or refinanced and the taxes are not escrowed, please contact the Borough office at (412) 241-7113 for a change in the tax notice mailing address. Also, please contact the County office at (412) 350-4107 for this change as well.



Also, voters in many states will be choosing between candidates for seats in the U.S. Senate. The term of a U.S. senator is six years, which means that every other year—whether it is a full presidential election or a midterm election—roughly a third of the seats in the Senate are in contention.

What do midterm elections mean for Pennsylvania? Pa. voters will elect a Governor, a U.S. Senator, 18 members of Congress, 25 State Senators and 203 State Representatives. In short, control of both the U.S. Congress and state government are up for grabs.

Churchill Aesthetics

The upkeep of your home is a reflection of your commitment and respect for your neighbors and community. Even the smallest eyesores can be a negative influence on an otherwise beautiful borough.

- Please keep your grass trimmed and property free of weeds.
- Please maintain your driveway free of debris, junk and clutter.
- Garbage cans may not be stored in view of the street or your adjoining neighbors' property. If you insist that they cannot be stored inside your home or garage, they may be hidden behind an appropriate screen that may be purchased at Lowe's or Home Depot.



- Yard signs promoting a good or service such as contracting signs, painter signs, landscaping services, etc. are an ordinance violation. This includes signs promoting local educational institutions.
- All vehicles parked in your driveway must maintain current registration stickers.
- Storage of boats or trailers on your property is an ordinance violation.

Final Blue Bin Collection:

On Friday, March 23, 2018, Republic Services will be collecting the last of the Blue Bins throughout the Borough. Please place the Blue Bin at the curb Thursday evening, March 22, 2018 for Friday, March 23, 2018 collection. Please note: This is the final collection of the Blue Bins. After this date, it will be the responsibility of the resident.

Garbage and Refuse 101

The Churchill Borough model of managing waste addresses a movement toward ZERO waste (reduce, reuse, recycle), aesthetics (waste collected in bins only), and cost (by controlling utilization and using automated service).

After some setbacks and hiccups during the roll-out period, garbage collection procedures are becoming smoother. Change is always difficult. Waste Management and Churchill Borough administrative staff are working hard to ensure residents' needs and concerns are addressed and satisfied.

These are a few reminders. For a more detailed explanation, please refer to the WASTE MANAGEMENT INFORMATIONAL PACKET on churchillborough.com website.

- All refuse/trash/garbage must be placed in an appropriate automated bin. Trash in bags or boxes outside the bins will not be collected!
- Recycling is now **mandated**. Please utilize the automated bin with a yellow lid.
- Bins intended for collection of cardboard will be located at the Borough Building beginning April 1, 2018. This is a trial program, and will be discontinued if the bin is filled with material other than cardboard, or the parking lot becomes cluttered with debris.
- A limit of two (2) bulk items may be placed at the curb for pick-up on the 1st Tuesday of each month. You may call and pay Waste Management to collect more than two (2) items, or have a collection on a non-scheduled bulk item day. Examples of bulk items include: appliances with freon removed, furniture, limited amount of carpeting, mattresses, etc. For a more comprehensive list of bulk items, please refer to churchillborough.com.
- Refuse in bags or boxes **DO NOT** qualify as a bulk item. Building materials **DO NOT** qualify as bulk items.

To participate in the electronic or hazardous waste program, you must set up a collection appointment. There are three ways to schedule a collection:

Spring Leaf and Yard Waste Program

- Dates: May 15th and 30th, June 12th, 26th, July 10th and 24th.
- Place leaves and yard waste in paper biodegradable bags on evening prior to pick-up at the curb
 - No plastic bags, taping or stapling bag shut

Acceptable items Leaves Trimmings, cuttings and clippings from trees. Small bushes and other plants, garden residue Longer branches-less than 3 feet in length-bundled together

Non-acceptable items Dirt, stones or grass clippings No heavy tree trunks, stumps, excessively large items accepted

Waste Management is managing the program this year. You do not have to schedule a pick up. They will be coming through the Borough the dates listed above. Please leave the biodegradable bags out on the evening prior to pick-up at the curb.

STREET SWEEPING

Street sweeping will be conducted throughout the Borough. Spring Dates: May 1st, 2nd, and 3rd. Fall Dates: September 17th, 18th, and 19th. Please assist by not parking your vehicle on the street during the hours of 7a.m. -3:30p.m. on these dates. Your cooperation will be appreciated.

2018 ROAD PAVING PROJECTS

Street paving will be performed on Longbow Drive, Nottingham Drive from Longbow Drive up past Scathelocke Road, part of McCrady from the Bullock-Pens park entrance up approximately 1,000 feet, and Stevendale Drive from the stop sign at Kings Dale up to the Borough line.



OUR FAMOUS "BLACK GOLD" WILL BE AVAILABLE IN JUNE

It's a finished, fibrous compost that the borough makes over the winter and spring from autumn leaves that residents rake into special, biodegradable, paper bags. Use it liberally as a mulch around all plants, including vegetables, flower beds, shrubs, and trees, leaving a 6-8" mulch-free "moat" around tree bases to discourage rodents from nesting and feeding at the bark. Your black gold will continue to age, retaining moisture, releasing plant nutrients (minerals) and improving the texture of your soil.

It will be ready for distribution on Saturday, June 9 and 16. Pick up a supply from the Joint Compost site located at the corner of Business Route 22 and Rodi Road between the hours of 8a.m. -1p.m. Bring your own containers and there is a suggested donation of \$2/vehicle. Delivery is available at a cost of \$10/bucket of mulch (2 buckets equals 4 cubic yards), plus \$30 for delivery. Please contact the Borough Office for delivery arrangements.

Avoid Putting These 10 Things Down Your Garbage Disposal

Most of us in Churchill wouldn't know what to do without our garbage disposals. With nearly 30% of American families' waste coming from food scraps, it makes sense that garbage disposals are used so often, as food scraps that would normally go into landfills are instead shredded and processed by sewer plants with other wastewater.

However, even though garbage disposals are a popular appliance for many American homeowners and are used on a regular basis, they are not always used correctly. Most people don't realize that not everything can be put down a garbage disposal. To avoid ruining the appliance and putting your kitchen sink out of commission, try to avoid putting these 10 items down your garbage disposal:

Grease 2. Bones 3. Cornhusks 4. Celery 5. Potatoes
 Seeds or Pits 7. Raw Meat 8. Starches 9. Seafood left-overs 10. Coffee grounds

A LETTER FROM **OUR FIRE COMPANY** PRESIDENT

After a very busy 2017, the New Year started off a record pace for Churchill Fire Company's volunteers. We responded to multiple in-

cidents on New Year's Day, including a building fire in Penn Center. The incidents continued through January, topping out at more than 40 emergency responses. February's heavy rains had our volunteers just as busy, with a number of service calls to assist borough residents with flooded basements, several assistance requests from the police department as well as other emergencies. You can follow our activity at our website, www.churchillfire. org, or on Facebook, tinyurl.com/y8ch6hwr. In the last newsletter, we announced a new fire truck is on the way to Churchill. As you read this, the truck is being assembled at the manufacturer in Wisconsin, and Fire Company representatives will be meeting with engineers to inspect the progress soon. We are eagerly anticipating the truck's arrival this summer and our firefighters are excited to begin training immediately on its new high-tech equipment. While the truck will provide great new capabilities and improve our response by replacing a 20 year old pumper, the \$350,000 price tag puts additional strain on the Fire Company's budget.

The majority of the Fire Company's yearly funding comes from individual donations from Churchill Residents. In 2017, only 39% of residents responded to our Fund Drive and that number has been slowly, but steadily decreasing over many years. Every donation matters in our small community; please help us to reverse that downward

We now accept contributions conveniently and securely online via PayPal at www.churchillfire.org/donate or you can respond to our Fund Drive letter. All donations are fully tax deductible. We also accept donations of your used cars and trucks. Vehicles donations are used for training our firefighters in vehicle rescue techniques, using the Jaws of Life to remove doors, roof, windshields, seats or anything else required to access someone trapped inside after an accident.

We also are excited to welcome a few new young firefighters who joined our team in 2017 and are always looking for more volunteer firefighters (16 years or older). All training and equipment is provided. Members are also eligible for a county-wide program called FireVest which provides FREE tuition at CCAC when committing to volunteer for five years. 

2018 Budget Expenditures \$3,024,329



The total expenditures for the Borough of Churchill for 2018 are budgeted at \$3,024,329. A safe and secure community is paramount and resources have been allocated to police activity for this commitment. As depicted in the chart, significant portions of the budget are allocated to road maintenance, road resurfacing, operations and maintenance. Our infrastructure needs are growing and will continue to be addressed responsibly in the future. This amount does not include sewer expenditures that are included under a separate sewer budget. Churchill's assessed real estate value no longer includes significant value from commercial entities that contributed to revenue streams in the past. The Churchill Council approved an increase of 0.5 mills to 6.98 mills to meet the demands of the 2018 budget. Please contact the Finance committee through the Borough Office with any questions.
