Minutes of Public Hearing

November 9, 2015

A public hearing was held for consideration of the enactment of an ordinance amending the Zoning Ordinance of the Borough of Churchill in the Community Room of Beulah Presbyterian Church on Monday, November 9, 2015 and was called to order by Mr. Dworin at 6:00 p.m. Mr. Dworin led the audience in the Pledge of Allegiance. Members present included Mses. McAbee, Law, Yankes, Messrs. Jurewicz, Collins and Riehl. Also present were Borough Manager/Secretary, Craig A. Robinson, Solicitor Gavin A. Robb, and Donna J. Perry.

The proposed amendment would amend Chapter 304 ("Zoning"), of the Code of the Borough of Churchill by amending and restating Section 304-37 ("Gas and Oil Well Production") in order to prohibit gas and oil well production and related activities in residential zoning districts and C-2 commercial districts with the Borough.

Solicitor Robb spoke first and provided a summary of the ordinance. The ordinance would prohibit gas and oil production in all residential districts and the C-2 district. The only allowable area for gas and oil production would be the C-1 district. By law, the proposed ordinance must be reviewed by the Planning Division of Allegheny County Economic Development. The County noted that the existing ordinance requires a 200-foot distance from the drilling site to occupied structures, but Pennsylvania's requirement through Act 13 of 2012 is 500 feet. Council does intend to review generally its conditions and to potentially increase restrictions and conditions in other areas of the Gas and Oil Well Production Ordinance. By limiting oil and gas drilling activity to the C-1 district, the County felt that it would meet the allowable land area requirements for the use. The Churchill Planning Commission voted to recommend passing the zoning amendment and also noted the Pennsylvania Oil and Gas Act requirement of the 500-foot distance.
